### How you can find technologies for licensing or co-development with NIH

- Search the website of the [NIH Intramural Research Program](#) for active research projects and/or researchers;
- Search all NIH-related funding for research projects on [NIH RePORTER](#);
- Contact [TTC's Technology Analysis and Marketing Unit \(TAMU\)](#) to discuss individual research or licensing needs. TAMU can:
  - Discuss research areas of interest and help you find appropriate NIH researchers with whom to work;
  - Direct you to the appropriate Technology Transfer Manager (TTM) based on the project of interest;
    - TTMs can set up a meeting with the NIH researcher and execute a Confidential Disclosure Agreement, if needed;
    - TTMs can negotiate and execute co-development or licensing agreements resulting from the discussions.
